1. PE Allocation: EYFS:

Key Stage 1: Up to 2 hours per week – gymnastics, dance, games & athletics activities.

Key Stage 2: 11/2 - 2 hours per week - swimming, games, athletics activities, dance,

gymnastics & OAA.

2. Lunchtime and After School Clubs:

<u>Key Stage 1</u>: Football, dance, gymnastics & multi-skills.

KS1 BOYS: 25% - 1 club, 16% - 2+ clubs **KS1 GIRLS:** 41% - 1 club, 20% - 2+ clubs

Key Stage 2: Football, netball, athletics, sportshall athletics, gymnastics, cheerleading,

dance & karate.

KS2 BOYS: 51% - 1 club, 30% - 2+ clubs **KS2 GIRLS:** 49% - 1 club, 20% - 2+ clubs

7. Which year groups have the PE & SCHOOL SPORT premium been spent on and why?

The funding has been spent on all children as the aim of the funding is to improve the breadth and quality of PE, PA and sporting provision across the school. We invest in CPD for staff as appropriate and have purchased specialist equipment to allow for the pupils to experience new skills in gymnastics under the guidance of a qualified coach. We have increased the competitive opportunities available for pupils and by offering a wider number of opportunities to take part in sports based events. (Level 1, and 2 events) and have entered A, B and C teams to allow more pupils to participate. We have worked alongside our PASS team to access resources, expertise and participation opportunities for our pupils. We have offered new and varied sporting opportunities for all year groups across the school. We have invested in a programme to increase physical activity in the classroom.
