What is Assistive Technology (AT)? Assistive Technology is any device, software or service that can assist learners in the completion of, and participation in, learning and development activities.





- 3. 'Spoken Content'
- Enable 'Speak Screen' by sliding tab so it turns green



- Live Captions




- 1. Select 'Slide Show'
- 2. Check 'Always Use Subtitles'
- Select Subtitle Settings and choose the Spoken Language and Subtitle Language. You can also choose the desired position of the captions or subtitles.
- Start the slide show and begin speaking. As you speak, your narrative will appear on-screen as captions or subtitles

Voice notes

Can use 'Voice notes' to record their ideas and they can repeatedly listen back to them whilst typing.

- Can have 6, 1 minute voice notes per document.
- Teacher can use voice notes to provide individual instructions on what to do.
