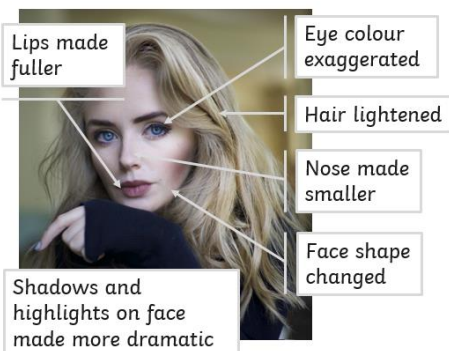
Key Facts
