Key Vocabulary

The four seasons

Autumn

 Leaves change colour and fall. Harvest time is in autumn.

Winter

 The coldest time of the year. Some animals hibernate.

Spring

 Flowers begin to grow. Some baby animals are born.

Summer

 The hottest time of the year. Flowers and trees are in full bloom.

The Four Seasons

autumn September October November	winter December January February
spring March April May	summer June July August

Seasons - There are four seasons each year, autumn, winter, spring and summer.

Weather - Includes the temperature outside, wind direction and strength, as well as rain, cloud, snow and sun.

Daylight - Is when it is light outside.

Spring - The weather starts to get warmer. Leaves begin to grow on trees. Plants begin to grow and you may see baby animals.

Summer - The weather gets hotter. The daytime is long and nights are short. Summer has the longest days. Trees are full of leaves.

Autumn - The weather begins to get colder. Leaves start to fall off trees. The amount of daylight is less.

Winter - The weather is colder. Sometimes it is cold enough to freeze or snow. Many trees have bare branches as their leaves have fallen off. The days are the shortest.
